



**Old Red Covered Bridge on Waverly Road, Mooresville, Indiana  
(Early 1900s-1910s)**

The old red covered bridge spanned the East Fork of White Lick Creek near today's intersection of State Roads 67 and 144 in Mooresville. It was a popular spot to swim during hot summer days. The bridge survived the Great Flood of March, 1913. (Photographs by J. P. Calvert).
