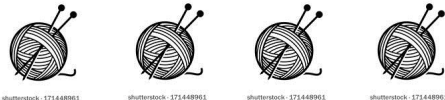

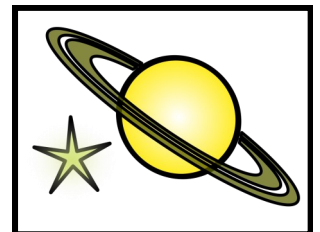
Link Observatory Programs
