Favorite song: Long Ago and Far Away



Class History

The social highlights of the year were two class parties, all school dances, and the leap year party. Mooresville was host to the band contest this year. The most outstanding event of the year was the winning of the Sectional and Regional tourneys.

In our sophomore year we again elected Ronald Magenheimer, President. Other officers were: Vice-President, Dominick Meo, Jr.; Secretary-Treasurer, Jane Henderson; Historian, Eugene Copeland; Student Council, Benny Couch. Several members of the class took part in the operetta, "H. M. S. Pinafore."



On August 31, 1946 we began the last lap of our journey through M. H. S. To lead us our final year we elected these officers: President, Eugene Copeland; Vice-President, Benny Couch; Secretary-Treasurer, Jane Henderson; Historian, Alice Shields, and Student Council, Barbara Vestal and James Carpenter. Our first activity was the initation of the "Freshies" lasting two days and climaxed by a party for the entire high school. On October 28, we had our senior pictures taken. Those members of our class interested in college took part in a college day at Martinsville in December. Several of our class have taken part in convocation programs. At this point we are looking forward to our class play, the prom, senior outing, and most of all, graduation. Although we will graduate with under thirty-five members, our record may well be envied by future classes of M. H. S.






