Football Chatter

- The 1951 edition of the Pioneer football team was composed of twelve seniors: James Mincy, Pat Henderson, Audrey Modlin, Harlan Elkin, Merle Goldman, Richard Horner, Bob Dobbins, Robert Story, Cecil Bailey, Jack Wise, Robert Allen, and Richard Allen.
- Returning for the 1952 season will be seven juniors: Jim Kayes, Ronald Mincy, Robert Hagee, Dale Almond, Richard Whitaker, Eddie Davenport, Donald Wright; three sophomores: Keith Bennett, Kent Bennett, Robert Baldwin; two freshmen: Donald Riggs, and James Bryant.
- The Pioneers won four, lost four, and tied one; which finished the fifth consecutive year that coach John Van Liew has not lost more than he won. In the five years since the renewal of football here, Mooresville has won twenty-two, lost sixteen, and tied three. All of the schedules have been against well regarded opponents, and through the success of the past five teams at Mooresville, football now takes a high place in the athletics of the school and the community. Following is a salute to the graduating seniors who have taken a big part in the success of football at Mooresville.
- Robert Allen: He was out for football for all four years of his high school career and lettered his last three. In his sophomore and junior years he played left halfback, and moved to fullback his senior year.
- Richard Allen: Richard was out for football his last three years of school. He lettered his junior year as a sub in the backfield and held down the regular halfback his senior year.
- Cecil Bailey: Cecil was out his sophomore year, laid out his junior year, then came back his senior year to letter at right guard.
- Bob Dobbins: Bob played four years, lettering his last two. He was a center all the way and won himself quite a reputation as a football player.
- Harlan Elkin: Dutch, as he is better known, was out for football four years, and lettered his last two at right tackle.
- Merle Goldman: Although his last year was the only year Merle played football he proved to be very adequate at right halfback.
- Richard Horner: Dick was out his last two years, lettering his senior year as a substitute in the backfield.
- Audrey Modlin: In four years of football Audrey lettered his last two as the regular quarterback and signal caller.
- Robert Story: Bob did not come out until late his junior year but developed into an outstanding guard as he lettered his last year.
- Jack Wise: Hick saw three years of football, lettering his last two as the regular left tackle.
- As these Pioneers leave, a lot of football experience goes with them, so it is up to the underclassmen to rise up and take their places and carry on the fine record of Mooresville football teams.




TRACK 1951

Although the all-conference basketball team is not yet known, Pete Scott, our forward and captain, is very probable to land a position.












