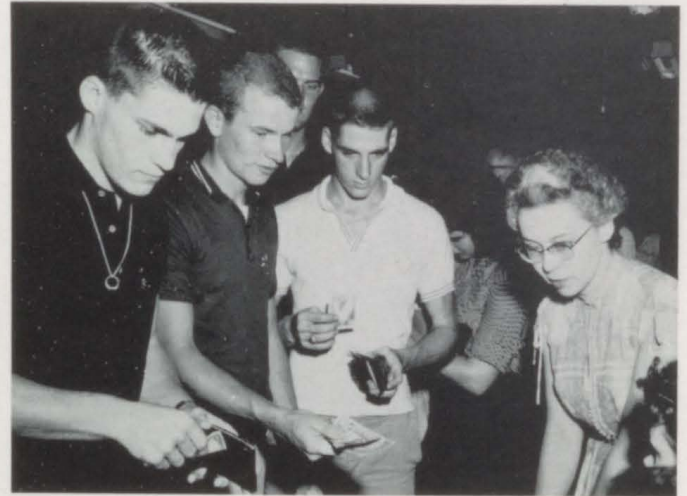

Dances, Concerts Spark Year

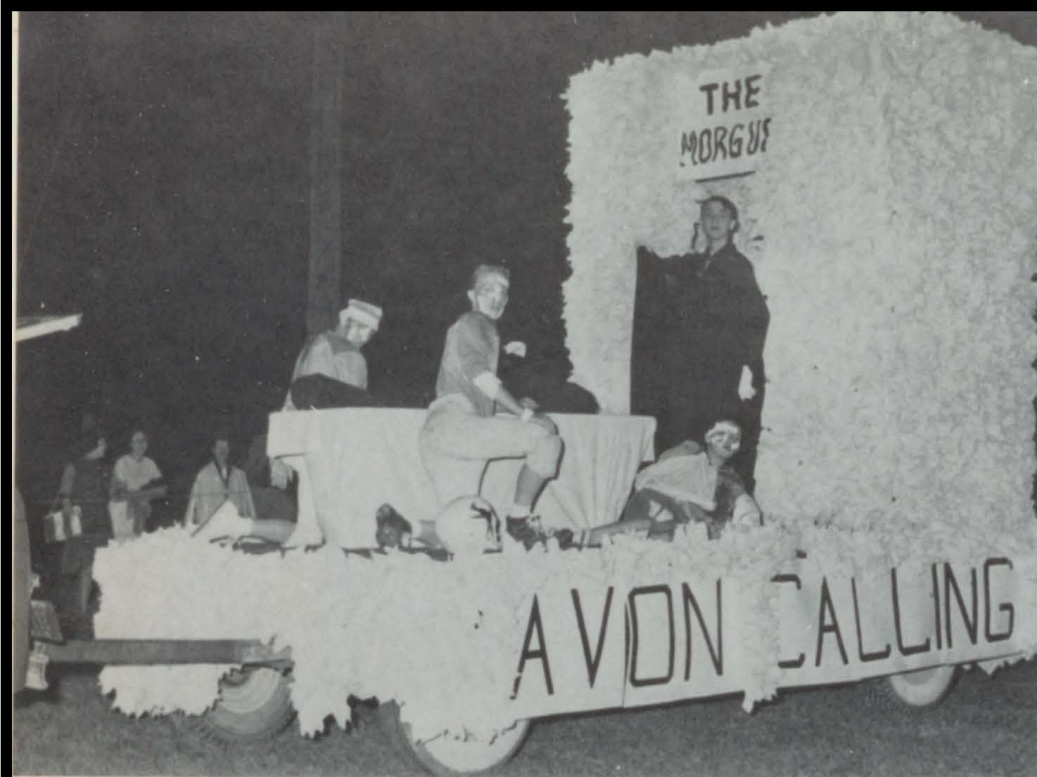
Many dances, concerts, and musical variety shows served to round out the extracurricular side of the student's life at MHS this year.

The football players and coaches led the parade and the seven floats through downtown Mooresville. A large group of people watched from the sidewalks and cheered the team toward a hoped for victory.

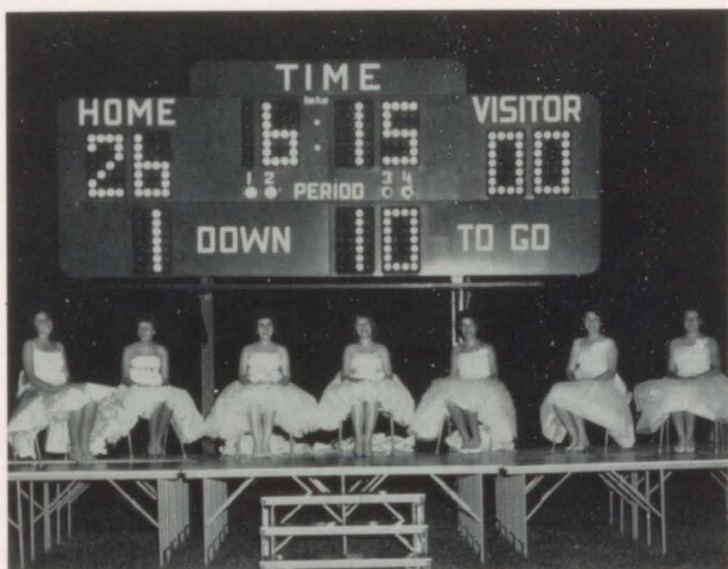
Later in the afternoon, a rousing pep session was held on the football field, with the new Alma Mater being sung for the first time by all the students.

Dan Koenig directs the concert choir in the Alma Mater written by Miss Webster especially for this occasion.



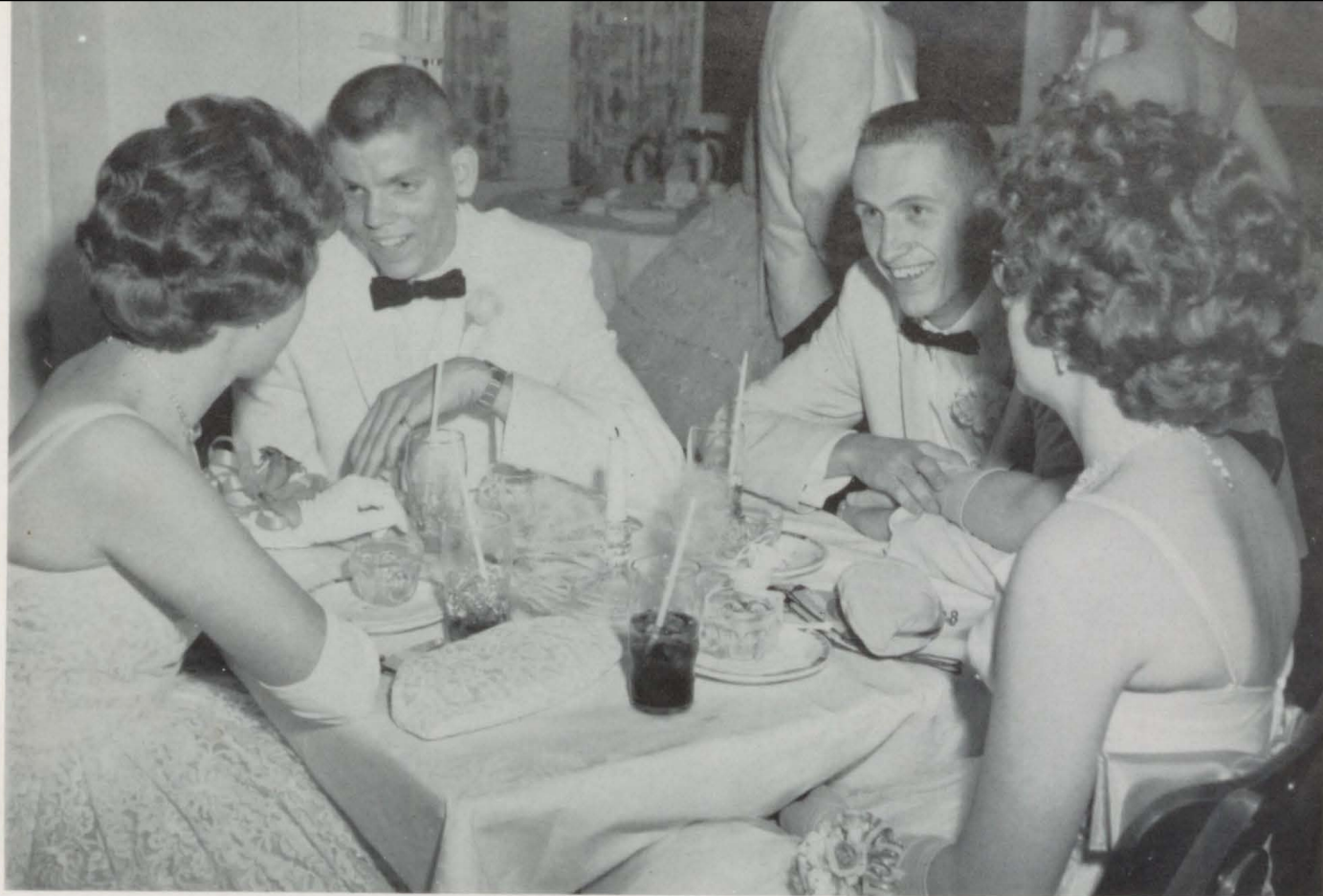

Mr. Harold Bell, superintendent of Mooresville's schools, granted the diplomas to the graduates.

President of the senior class, Tom Sundling, who introduced the speaker, then gave the rest of the class the signal when they all had that important piece of paper in their hands to "turn their tassels." This tassel symbol has long been used to designate a graduate.

Barbra Breidenbaugh, Valedictorian, and Sandra Neimeier, Salutatorian, gave their addresses to the class. With the strains of the well-chosen words and the haunting memory of "Pomp and Circumstance" fresh in the graduates' minds they were no longer seniors. 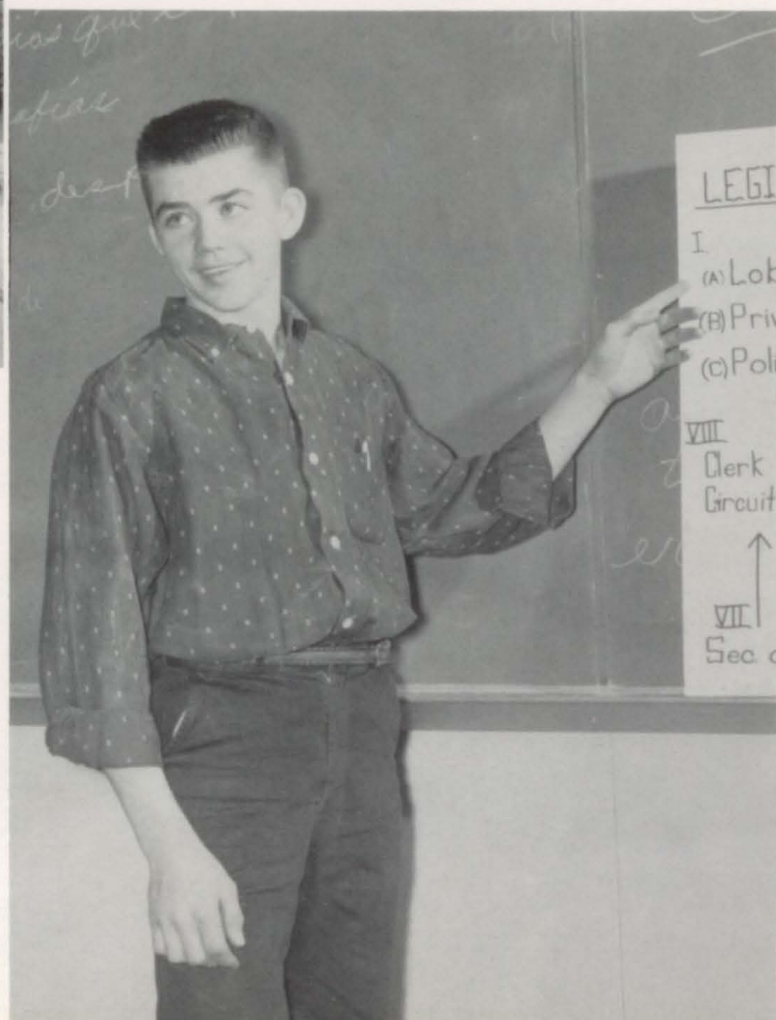
Students Review World Problems



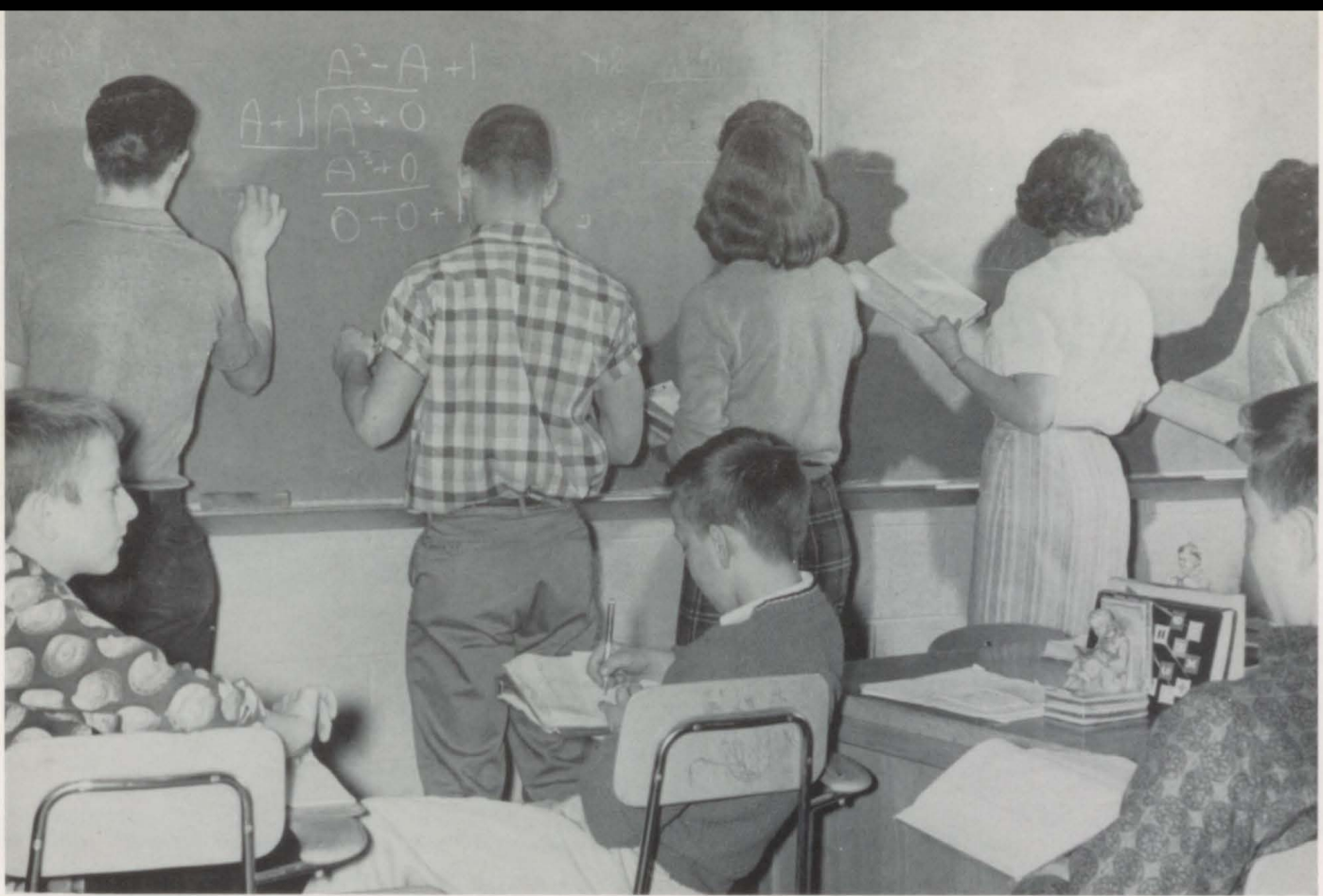

Social problems class, through taking polls, wrote reports on how the town and surrounding community could be improved.



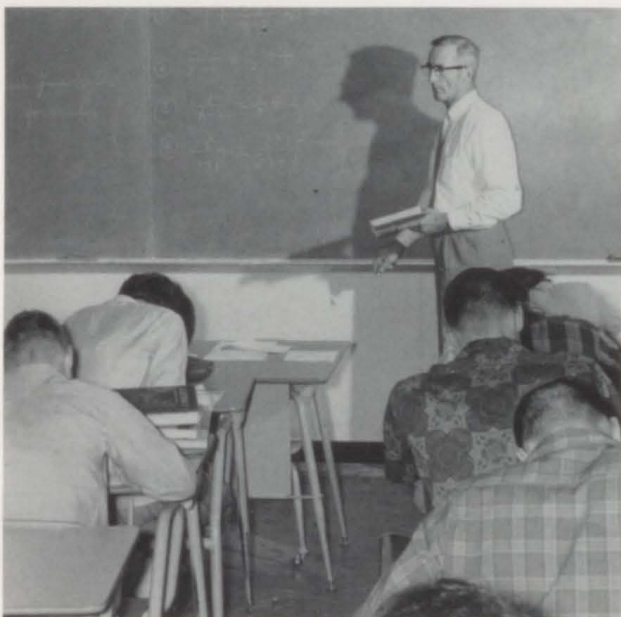

Math courses are offered to all students of M.H.S. and attendance in these classes was found to be on the upgrade. More and more students realized the need for math in every field of work and have added it to their program.

The math department made an exceptional showing in the Regional Achievement Contest at Plainfield this past year. All teachers of the different math courses, which include: algebra I and II, plane and solid geometry, and trigonometry, strove for better methods of teaching and the betterment of the students.

Business Classes Prepare for Future

Business students found that it pays to be alert. First year typing stressed the learning of the keyboard, while the second year constituted gaining speed. Office practice gave the students experience in filing and running business machines.

Shorthand, a method of faster writing, was sought by those students seeking secretarial work after graduation.

Wood shop, next door to the metal shop, also stressed safety. In this course, boys often designed and made their own projects. Projects varied from a model house to a handsome bookcase.

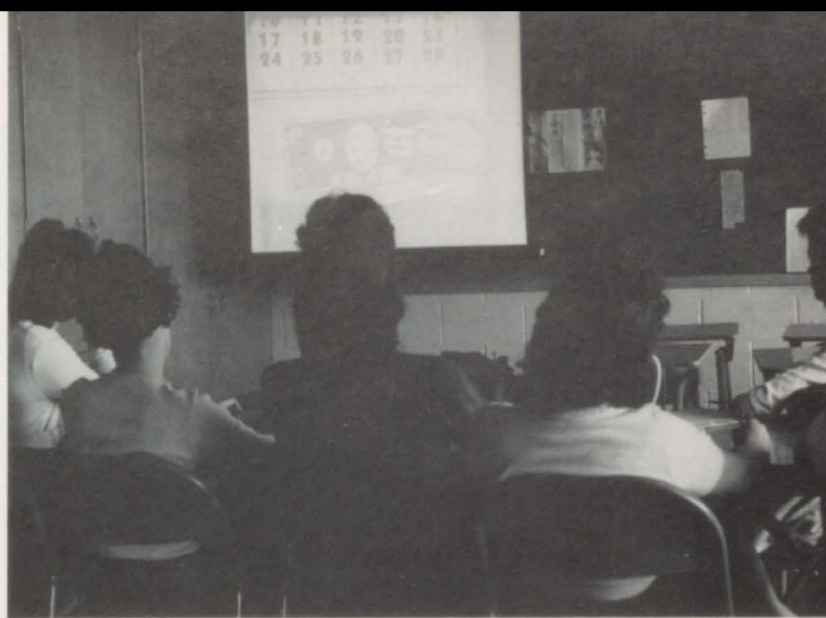

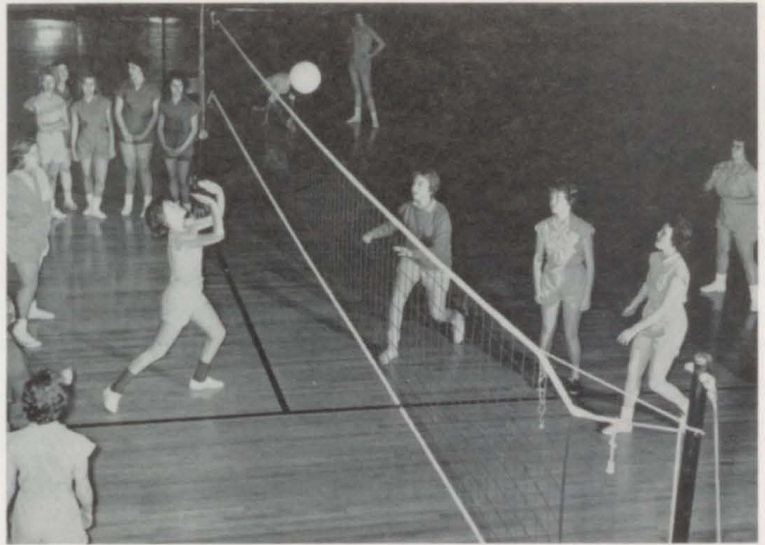

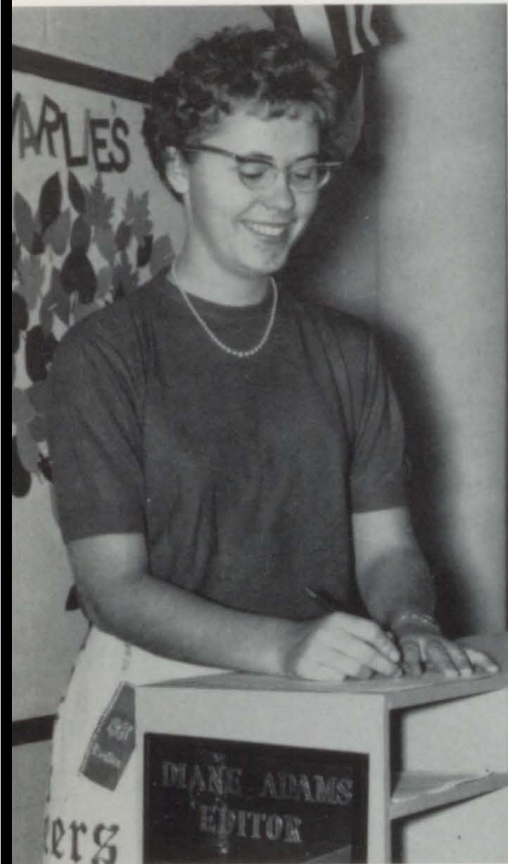

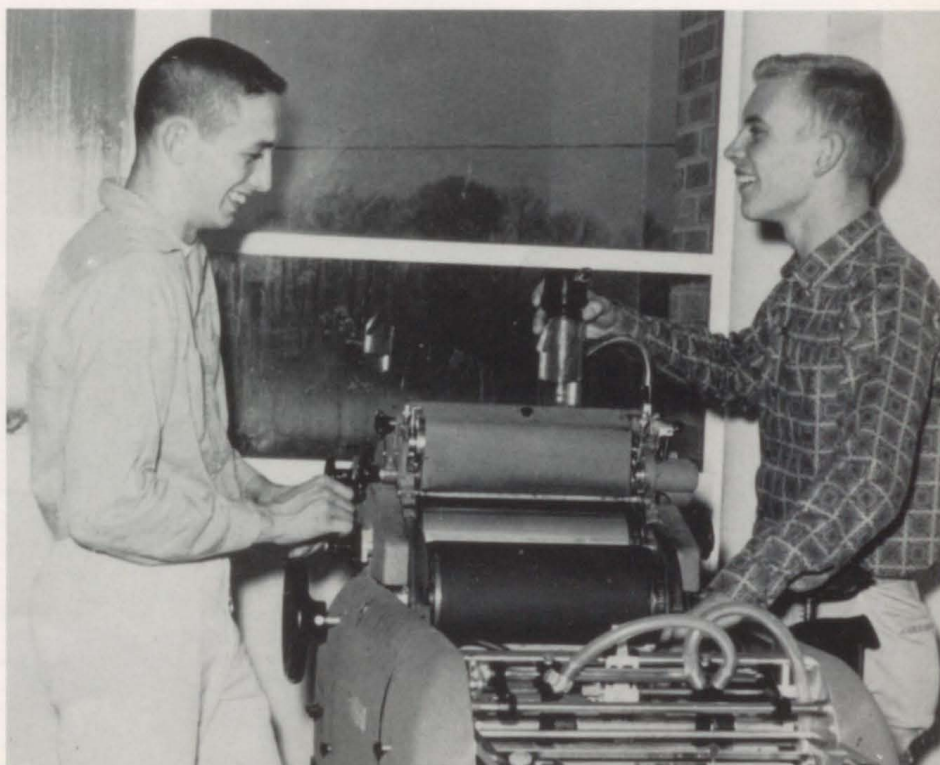

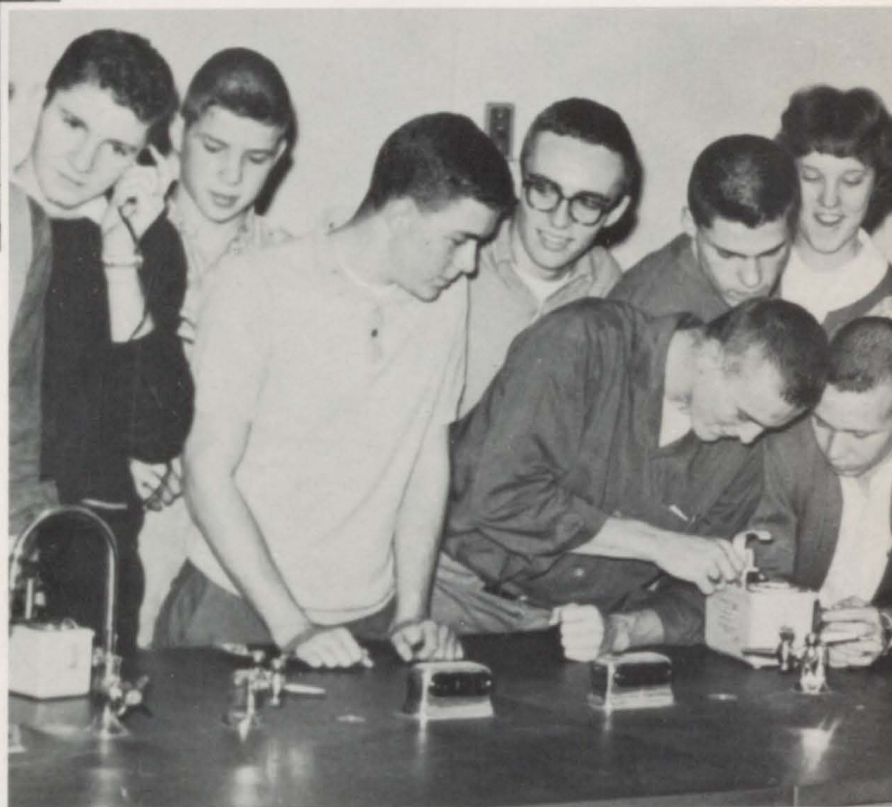

F.H.A. and F.F.A. Attended Conventions



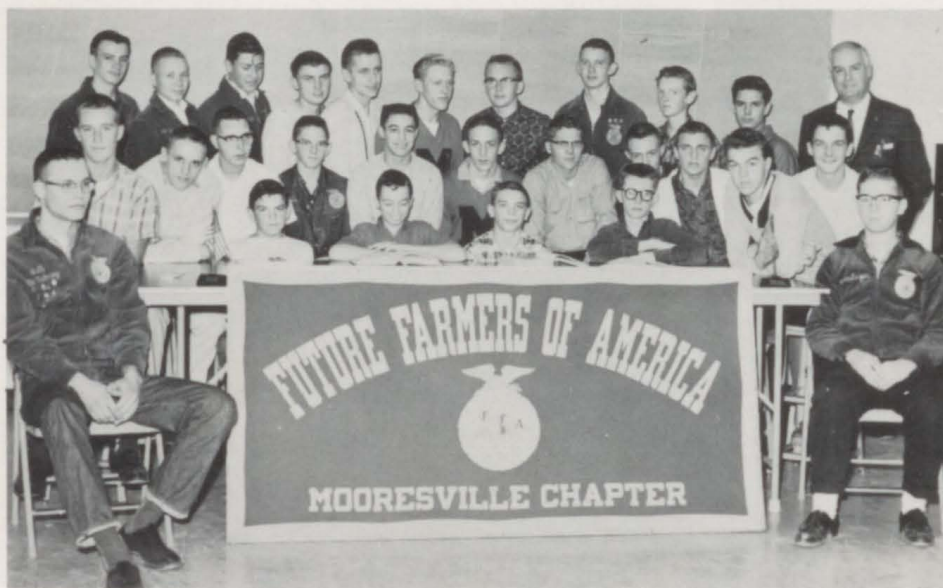
Attending the spring and fall district meetings aided the FHA girls in attaining their goal of being an honor chapter.

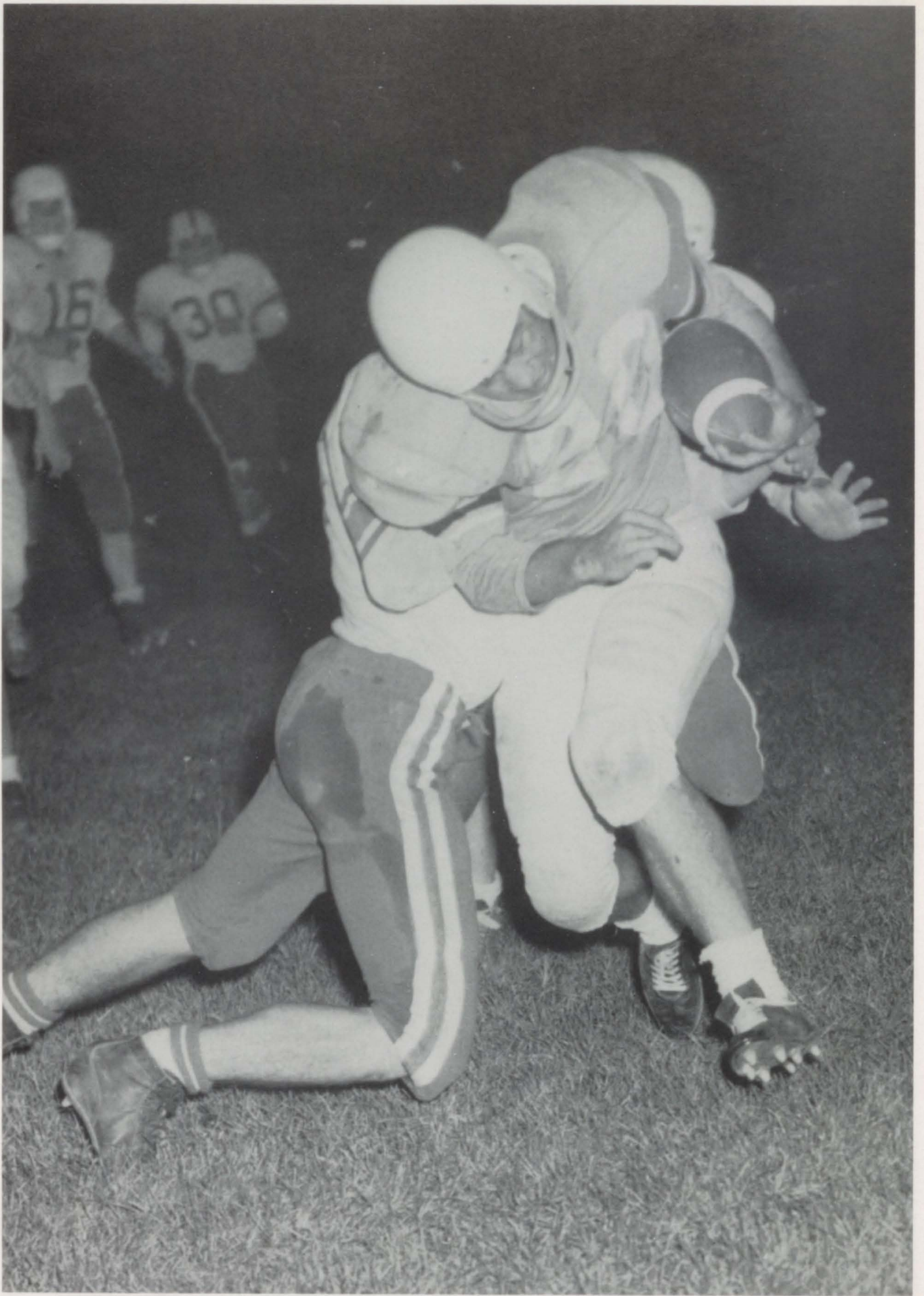

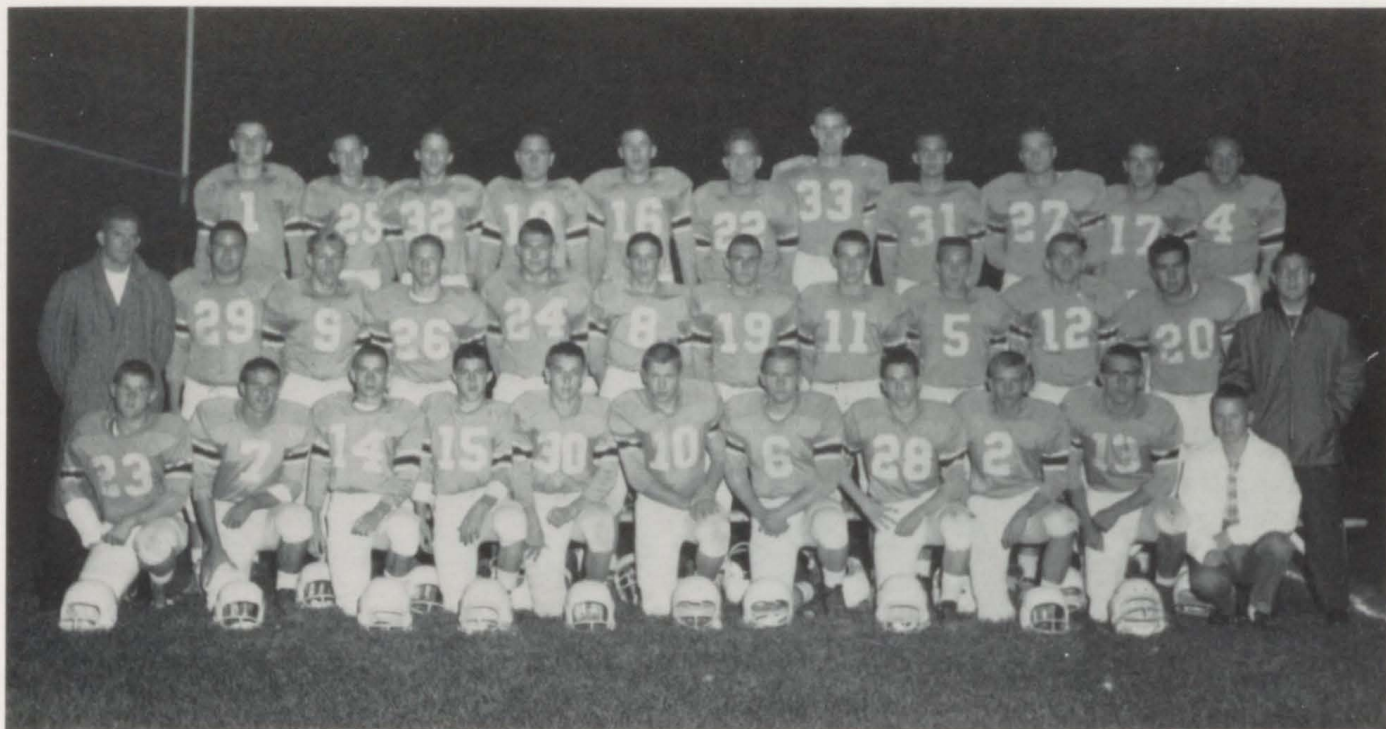

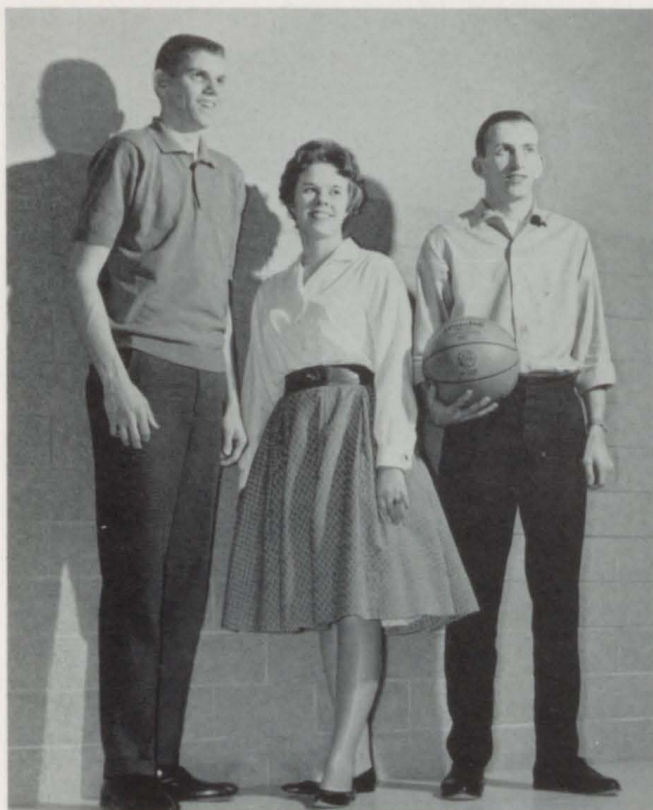

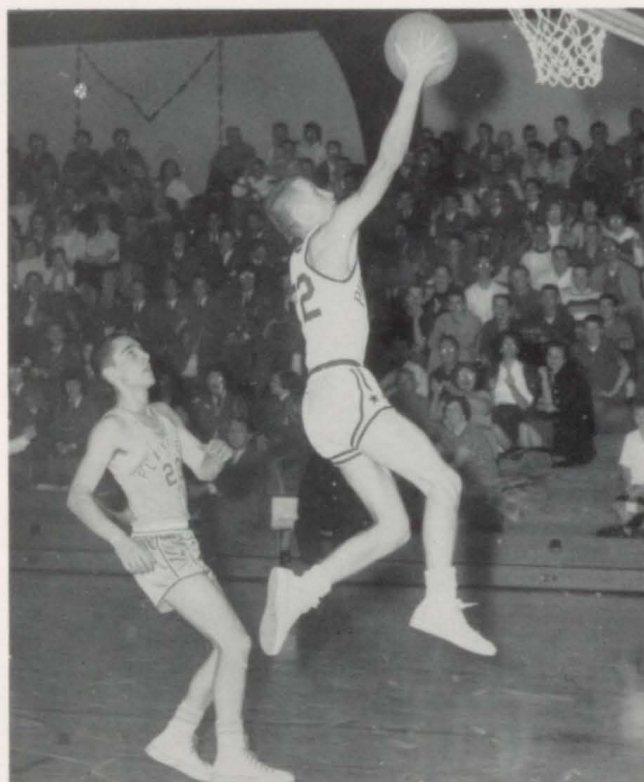

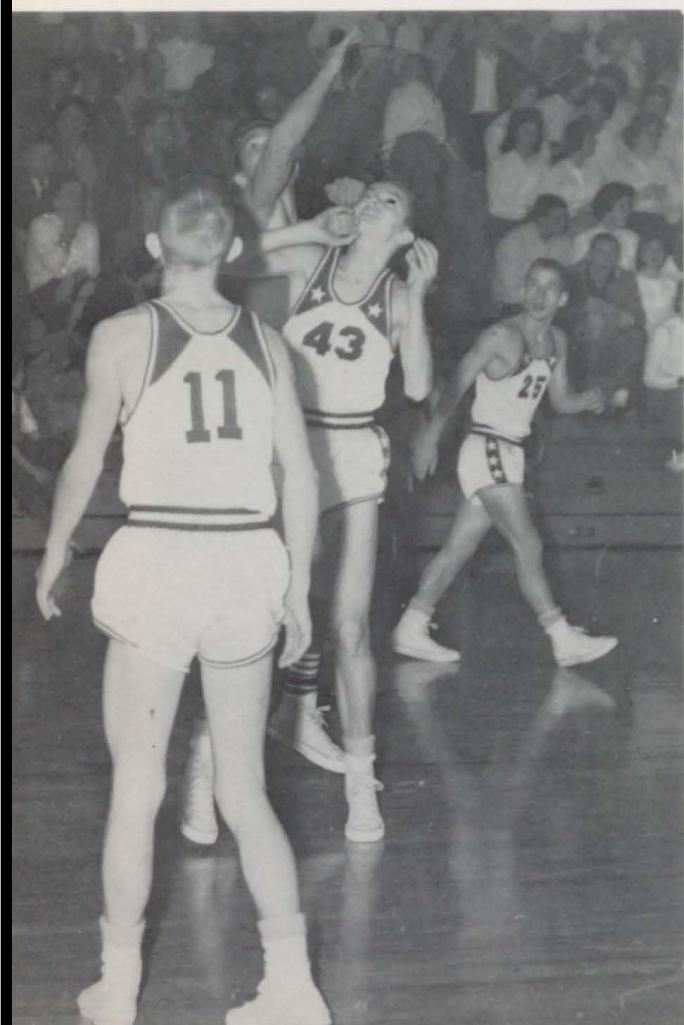

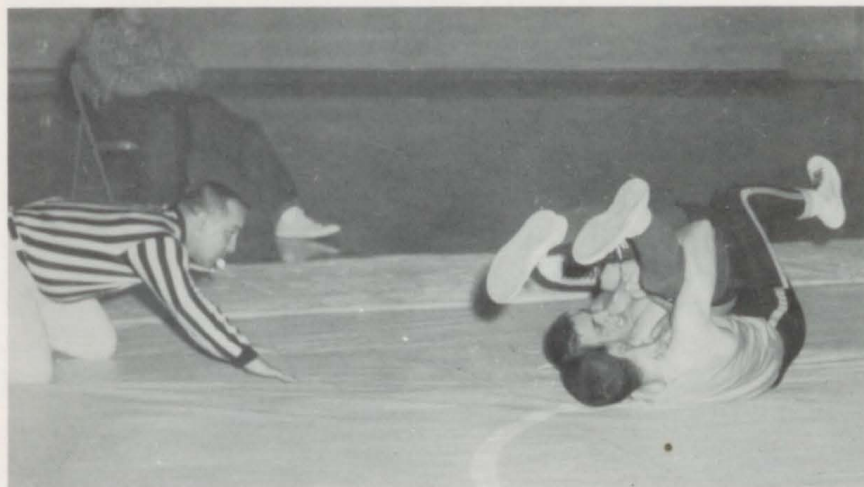

Pioneers Grapple to 8-6-1 Season

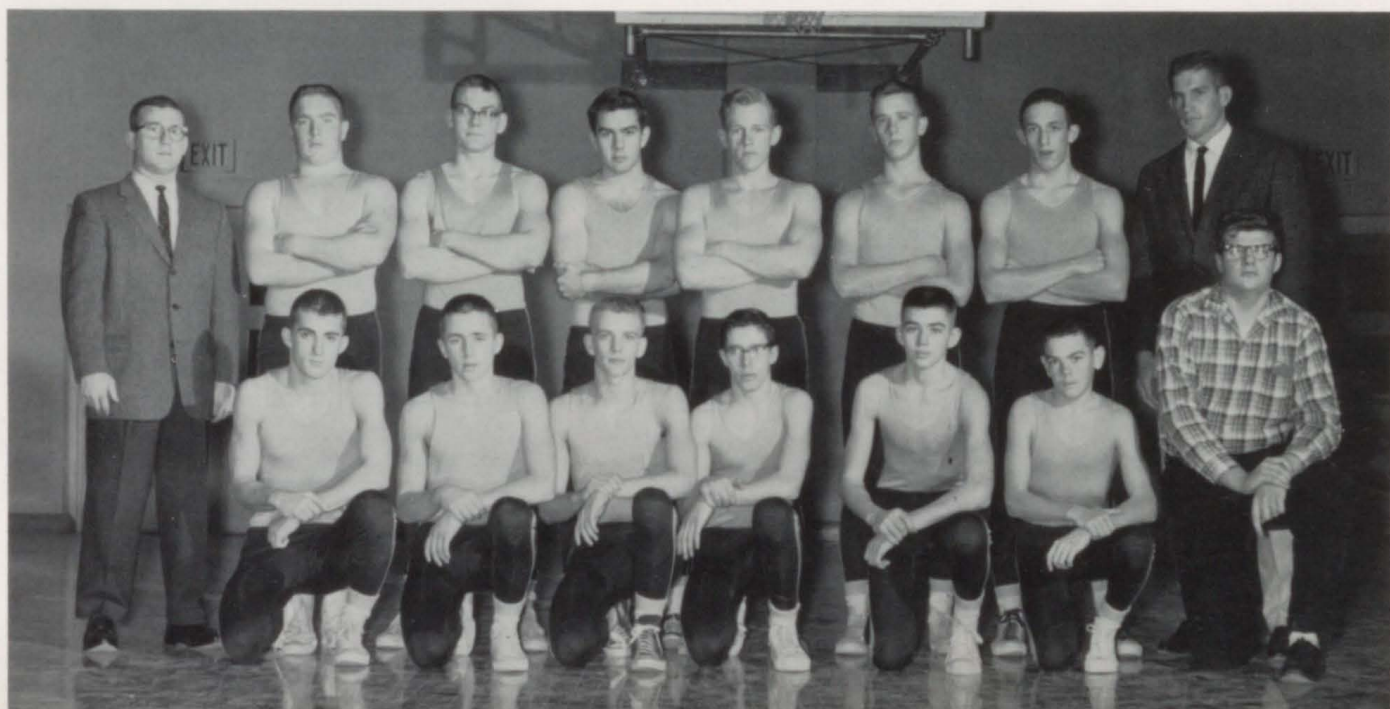
After dropping their first match to Greenwood, the Pioneer wrestlers took six straight matches with victories over Southport's junior varsity and Carmel.

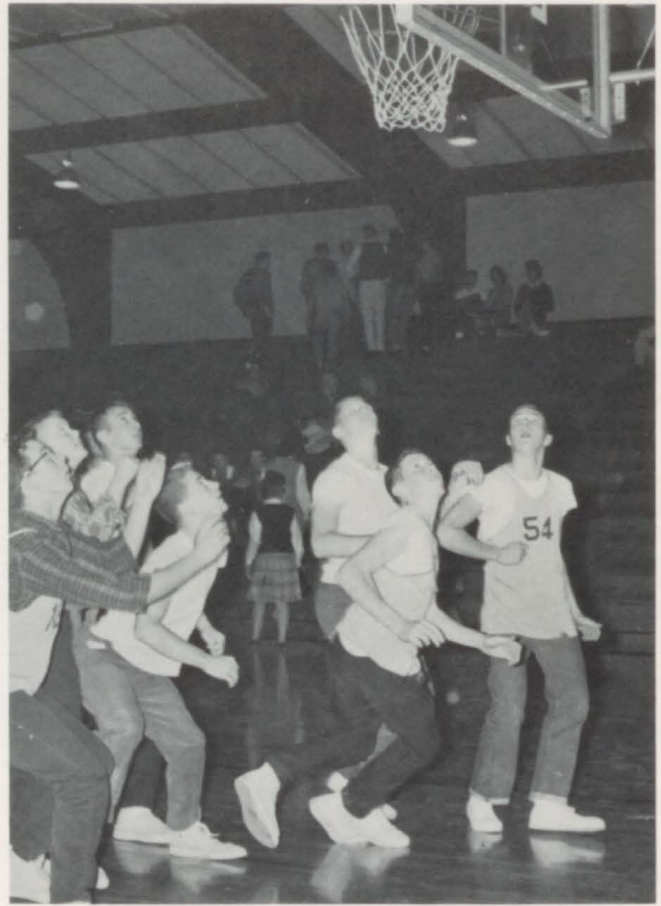
