


- Citizens groups & public first meet to discuss creation of Mooresville Public Library (October 1911)

- \$10,000 Grant Application to Andrew Carnegie Foundation (July 1912)




In March, 1913, a temporary library reading room was established on the 2nd floor of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF)

Building (1881-1989), located at the site of the Hadley mini-park downtown.

The IOOF Building was partially demolished during the mid1960s. The remaining singlestory structure (far left end,
where people are standing in photo) was removed in 1989.



On January 27, 1916,
Mooresville Public Library
was dedicated. It was located
at 30 (later renumbered as 32)
West Main Street downtown.
The "Carnegie Library"
served the community
from 1916-1988.



Public Furor Over Proposed MPL Site (Spring, 1913)











Your kind favor of January 9th received. The library board of Mooresville and Brown Township wish to thank you for the offer of \$10,000. with which to build a library building.

In our last letter to you we gave verified statements that

Mooresville and Brown Township had levied a tax which gives a library income of \$1,542. a year. Our property valuation is not likely to decrease, as we are only sixteen miles from Indianapolis and
the city is extending our way. With the minimum township tax we would
have an income of \$1,100. per year. Would it be possible for Mr.

Carnegie to give us the sum of \$12,500.7 With this amount we can
build a building which will adequately meet our needs. If this does
not meet with your favor, we shall be glad to accept the \$10,000. and
will mail to you the required resolution passed by the town board of
trustees when we hear from you.

Library Accepts the Carnegie Grant (May 6, 1915)

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, the carnegie Corporation of New York has offered to give ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to the Town of Moores-ville and Brown Township of Morgan County, Indiana, for the purpose of erecting a Free Public Library on Lot four (4), Block three (3) in the town of Mooresville, Indiana.

Therefore, be it resolved, that we, the Town Board of Mooresville and Advisory Board of Brown Township, jointly accept the gift and pledge ourselves that the building will be erected on said lot at cost not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), and read for occupancy.








