1901 BRIDGE AT "HOUSE'S BRANCH"

On August 17, 1901, several citizens and taxpayers of Mooresville and Brown Township (in Morgan County, Indiana) petitioned the Morgan County Board of Commissioners to construct a timber beam bridge across "House's Branch" of a creek, which merged with White Lick Creek to the south, on the public road that ran between the Mooresville-to-Waverly Road and Henderson's Ford on the White River. Today, we know this "public road" as Rooker Road (originally, the Rooker Trace, a pioneer trail used since the early 1820s by settlers), and "House's Branch" is called Orchard Creek today. The House family owned the surrounding farmland for generations. The "House house," which was the House family homestead, burned *circa* 1974.

The original 1901 petition (and accompanying transcription) is included at the end of this handout.

In September, 1912, the Morgan County Council appropriated \$800 to construct a new bridge at "House's Branch" to replace the 1901 wooden beam structure. (The replacement bridge was built in Spring, 1913.) In February, 1913, the Morgan County Commissioners approved construction specifications and plans prepared by H.A. Blunk, who was paid \$8.60 for his plans. The lowest construction bid (\$754) came from James A. Parish, of Greenfield, Indiana. The 1913 bridge was likely to have been a reinforced concrete structure.



1901

Whereas, it is proposed to construct a bridge over a certain water course, commonly known as House's Branch, on the public highway leading from the Mooresville and Waverly Gravel Road in Brown Township, Morgan County, Indiana, to the Henderson Bridge over White River, in said County; and Whereas, the probable costs of constructing and building the necessary approaches to said bridge will be one hundred dollars. Now we, the undersigned, in consideration that said bridge is to be built and constructed by the proper township and county authorities, do hereby promise and agree to pay the sums set opposite our respective names for the purpose of defraying the cost, to-wit, one hundred dollars, of building and constructing direct approaches to said bridge; said sums being payable in money or work, at the option of the subscribers.
