The Mooresville Public Library certainly is the hub of learning and enjoyment for the community, which is quite proud of this treasure. There is something for everyone at the library and all ages frequent the building provided by its friendly staff. Mothers bring their tots and preschoolers for the weekly programs in the children's area while teens meet after school in the Young Adult Room. Patrons enjoy the large circulation area where books and audiovisuals are housed and available for checking out at self-serve stations or at the friendly staffed circulation desk. Heritage treasures are housed in the Indiana Room where questions about the treasure trove history of Mooresville and Indiana may be found. Available in all these areas are capable staff members with answers to questions which patrons might have.

Although books are what most people come to the library for, Mooresville library offers so much more. Computers are available for anyone; Beyond Books, a service which supplements the library's books, offers a wide variety of games, cookware, toys, musical instruments, puzzles, virtual reality glasses, and more; patrons may schedule study rooms; and receive help filling out taxes. Many area meetings are held in the large community room. During the Covid Pandemic, the library used curbside pickup which is still available if desired. All the services available at the library are explained on the library's website, including checking the catalog and placing holds on desired books. The website's calendar also lists when varied classes are available and how to sign up for these. Friends of the Library maintain a Sale Room where patrons can donate books which are then available for purchase at an affordable price. Passes to Indianapolis museums and Indiana parks are available for free. The library works with the town park to offer a Storybook Trail with a different book posted each month around a park trail. Mooresville, Indiana, would not be the friendly, small community that it is without its public library, the Mooresville **Public Library!**

After more than a year of public feedback and analysis, the Mooresville Public Library Board of Trustees voted to invest in the library and create a new chapter for our community's future.

For adults, by finishing the basement, an addition of nearly 9,000 square-foot, will provide an experience unlike any other in the area. The expansion will provide for more public spaces on the main floor to connect with community members, discover a new book, attend a class or find a quiet place. **For children and teens**, the expansion will provide an experience designed to capture the imagination and inspire a love of life-long learning.

The updates will include an expanded teen and children's areas with tech maker space, public computer/business center, quiet reading area, individual study/learning spaces and much more.
